TAMIL NADU

Cut flowers centre at Kothanur

- Israeli delegates visited cut flowers centre at Kothanur near Thally in Krishnagiri.
- Consul general of Israel to South India, Jonathan Zadka and his deputy Ariel Seidman visited the Indo-Israel joint agriculture project (IIAP) at Kothanur.
- Israel had helped to set up 29 centers of excellence throughout India as part of its bilateral cooperation in agriculture.

The cyclonic storm Burevi over Bay of Bengal

- It is likely to cross the Indian coast on the early morning of December 4 between Kanyakumari and Pamban.
- The storm will make the initial landfall near Trincomalee in Sri Lanka.
- The name "Burevi" has been given by Maldives, which means black Mangroves.
- According to IMD's forecast track of the cyclone, the storm is likely to emerge again over the sea near south Kerala coast after crossing the south Tamil Nadu coast.

Copper plate of the18th century Nayak period

- A copper plate of the18th century Nayak period has been found from a villager in Karisalpatti in Karumathur, 25km from Madurai.
- The plate mentions about the 'watch-and-ward' social order system that was prevalent in the village during the Nayak period.
- There are 40 lines of Tamil script written on the plate, which highlights the social life of the people in this region.

Eco-sensitive zone (ESZ) of Kanyakumari Wildlife Sanctuary

• The Madras high court - granted interim stay on the Union government's gazette notification declaring eco-sensitive zone (ESZ) of Kanyakumari Wildlife Sanctuary.

An all – Woman police at suramangalam

- An all woman police station at Suramangalam in salem city has been rated as the second best performing police station in the country for the year 2020.
- Nongpok Sekmai Police Station in Thoubal district of Manipur was ranked as the country's best police station on the annual ranking list released by the Union Home Ministry.

The renovated National Art Gallery at the Government Museum in Egmore

- The renovated National Art Gallery at the Government Museum in Egmore is set to reopen in January 2021.

Mullaperiyar drinking water project

- Chief Minister Edappadi K. Palaniswami laid the foundation stone for the ₹ 1,295.76 crore Mullaperiyar drinking water project
- The Mullaperiyar drinking water project envisages laying of pipelines from Lower Camp near Gudalur to Madurai city
- It would provide round-the-clock safe drinking water to all the residents in 100 wards of Madurai
- The project will provide additional 1.1 lakh water connections to the residents of Madurai.

Relief fund

- Tamil Nadu government has sought ₹3,759 crore Central assistance to carry out relief and restoration of Cyclone Nivar-affected districts
- Out of the total amount, the state has sought temporary relief of Rs 650 crore

Bio- mining at Pallikaranai yard

- More than 14 acres in Pallikaranai will be cleared of legacy waste by the end of January, with the Greater Chennai Corporation having completed 80 per cent of bio-mining at the former dumping yard near the marshland.
- "Bio-mining process involves segregation of waste into reusable and nonreusable products. We have bio-mined a large portion of the waste, and kept the segregated reusable waste separately inside the yard. Once the COVID-19 lockdown is further relaxed, it will be sent to industries as raw materials. The work will be completed before January," said a Corporation official.

Vayalur thermal plant

- Work on the 2x660 MW Ennore SEZ thermal power project at village.
- The project which was initially configured as 2x800 MW, was changed to 2x660 MW in 2018.
- Tangedco informed the EAC that the time schedule now to complete the project is 2022-23 and that 45% physical progress and 55% of financial progress had been achieved.

"Raimona National Park"

- Assam Proposed to set up its 6th National Park "Raimona National Park" in the Ripu Reserved Forest
- The Assam government has proposed to its establish its 6th National Park, the "Raimona National Park" in the Ripu Reserved forest of the state which was severely damaged due to militancy.

Leopard Conservation Project

- In a first of its kind initiative, Gujarat forest department has implemented a leopard conservation project under PPP mode
- The project is implemented under public private partnership between the Reliance Industries Limited and the state government

The blue tide phenomenon

- It was recently observed in several stretches of Maharashtra coast, including in the Juhu Beach
- The phenomenon is due to a phenomenon called 'bioluminescence', which is the emission of light by microscopic marine plants called phytoplanktons. Eg: dinoflagellates.
- The blue light results due to the chemical reactions of proteins inside the organism

Kolkata's Majerhat Bridge named "Jai Hind" to Mark Netaji's

• West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee named the newly-built Majerhat bridge in Kolkata as 'Jai Hind' bridge to commemorate the 125th Birth Anniversary of Subash Chandra Bose.

"Child-friendly" police station

• It was recently established in Pune as per the guidelines provided by the National Commissioner for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR).

First ever migratory bird festival this year

- Bihar government is planning its first ever migratory bird festival this year.
- This is a three-day festival to be conducted in Bhagalpur District in Bihar
- The festival is to be jointly organised by Bhagalpur forest division, Bombay Natural History Society and the local Mandar Nature Club.

Suryadhar lake at Doiwala

• Trivendra Singh Rawat, Chief Minister of Uttarakhand inaugurated the Suryadhar lake on Jakhan river at Doiwala, Dehradun district, Uttarakhand. The man made lake is built at a cost of around Rs 50.24 crore. The lake has been named after social worker Gajendra Dutt Naithani.

"Organ donor Memorial"

• In the occasion of 11th National Organ Donation Day celebration at Jaipur, Rajasthan CM Ashok Gehlot inaugurated virtually the first of its kind "Organ Donor Memorial" in the country.

- Hornbill festival known as "Festival of Festivals" is organised by the state tourism of arts and culture department of Nagaland at the Naga Heritage Village of Kisama, Kohima.It is a 10-day event.





NATIONAL

Global climate deal

- India has proposed to set up an apex committee, comprising members from its 13 key ministries to coordinate actions for achieving its goals under the global climate deal.
- The Paris Agreement on Climate Change will officially come into force from January 1, 2021.
- The apex body will also function as a national authority to regulate carbon markets in India under the Paris Agreement in post-2020 period.

Mission COVID Suraksha


- Government of India has allocated Rs.900 crore to Department of Biotechnology(DBT) for research and development of COVID-19 vaccines under Mission COVID Suraksha. This is the third stimulus package, already a stimulus of Rs.900 crore for a period of 12 months has been allocated for phase 1 trials.
- Objective of the fund :- to quicken the process of pre-clinical& clinical development; licensure of COVID-19 vaccine, and strengthening the existing immunoassay laboratories, central laboratories and suitable facilities for animal studies, production facilities, and other testing facilities to support COVID-19 vaccine development.

The Election Commission

- It has sent a proposal to law ministry for allowing the Non-resident Indians (NRIs) to vote remotely from their country of residence.
- At present, the NRIs must cast their vote in person in India.
- As per the EC's suggestion, the NRIs are to be allowed to vote through electronically-transmitted postal ballot system (ETPBS).
- This facility is already available to service voters that include members of the armed forces, paramilitary and government employees serving abroad.

Army chief on crucial visit to UAE & Saudi

- Army Chief General MM Naravane left on a six-day tour of the United Arab Emirates and Saudi Arabia, in a rare visit reflecting India's growing strategic ties with the two influential Gulf nations.
- The visit comes in the midst of fast-paced developments in the Gulf region including normalisation of Israel's relations with several Arab countries as well as situation arising out of the assassination of Iran's top nuclear weapons scientist Mohsen Fakhrizadeh.
- It is for the first time that an Indian Army chief is visiting the two Gulf nations, officials said.



• A new study has found the presence of animal products, including cattle and buffalo meat, in ceramic vessels dating back about 4,600 years at seven Indus Valley Civilisation sites in present day Haryana and Uttar Pradesh.

Cybersecurity Capabilities

• A cyber security firm, Kaspersky and the Indian Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT-In) announced a strategic partnership for improving mutual cybersecurity capabilities by working together in order to create a safe and secure cyberspace in India.

Odisha hosts 9th International Sand Art festival and 31st Konark Dance festival

• Odisha government's tourism department has organised the 9th edition of International Sand Art festival at Chandrabhaga Beach in Odisha's Puri district and parallely the 31st edition of Konark dance festival following the COVID-19 protocols.

DoS Signed 1st of its kind NDA with Agnikul Cosmos

• The Department of Space (DoS) has signed first one of its kind Non-Disclosure Agreement (NDA) with Agnikul Cosmos Pvt. Ltd under which the latter can access the facilities and technical expertise of Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) for its launch vehicle development programme.

The New Parliament building

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone of the New Parliament building on December 10 with a 'Bhoomi Pujan' for the project.
- The Parliament project is scheduled to be completed by 2022, coinciding with 75 years of India's independence.
- The new Parliament building will remain as a symbol of "atmanirbhar Bharat" and a "temple of democracy" for Independent India, according to Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla.

The serum Institute of India

• It became the first Indian company to apply to the Drugs Controller General of India seeking emergency use authorisation for the Oxford Covid-19 vaccine, Covishield.

The Defence Ministry

- It has approved the creation of a new post in the Army- Deputy Chief for Military Operations and Strategic Planning.
- The Deputy Chief will deal with strategic planning, military operations, intelligence and operational logistics.



Policy on school Bag 2020

- Union Ministry of Education has unveiled the new 'Policy on School Bag 2020'
- The recommendations are based on various surveys and studies conducted by the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT).
- According to the new policy, school bags should not be more than 10% of the body weight across Classes I to X and there should be no homework till Class II.
- It also recommends that the weight of the bag needs to be monitored on a regular basis in schools

Laying of undersea optical fibre cable to connect 11 islands of Lakshadweep with Kochi

- The Union Cabinet approved laying of undersea optical fibre cable to connect 11 islands of Lakshadweep with Kochi by May 2023, to help improve broadband connectivity in the Union Territory.
- The project is estimated to cost about ₹1,072 crore, including operational expenses for five years.

Public Wi-Fi hotspots

- The government gave permission to setting up of lakhs of public Wi-Fi hotspots.
- The Union Cabinet approved the Public Wi-Fi Access Network Interface (WANI), which aims to provide access to easy and seamless Wi-Fi connectivity at minimal cost across the entire country.

WCF, NITI Aayog Partner to provide training to Country's Children and Youth on Cybersafety

• WCF (WNS Cares Foundation), the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) wing of Private firm WNS Global Services has partnered with Atal Tinkering Labs (ATL), an initiative under Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), NITI Aayog for providing training to India's children and youth on cybersafety. WCF will provide digital education through its platform CyberSmart.



INTERNATIONAL

"Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development" (OECD)

- India tops the list of sending Most Number of Educated Migrants to OECD Countries.
- Most Common birth countries of Highly Educated Migrants residing in OECD Nations, India came at the top with around 3.12 Million Highly Educated Migrants living in the OECD Nations as of 2015-16 data.

7th India-Suriname Joint Commission Meeting (JCM) was held virtually

 The meeting was Co-Chaired by the Minister of State for External Affairs, V. Muraleedharan & Albert R. Ramdin, Minister of Foreign Affairs, International Business and International Cooperation of the Republic of Suriname.

"Artificial Sun" nuclear fusion reactor

• China - successfully powered up its "artificial sun" nuclear fusion reactor for the first time, providing a milestone in the country's nuclear power research capabilities.

The Five Eyes Countries

- The Five Eyes countries recently expressed their concern about increasing Chinese curbs on the autonomy of Hong Kong and its freedom and rights.
- The Five Eyes (FVEY) is an intelligence alliance consisting of Australia, Canada, the UK, New Zealand and the US.

5th Presidium Meeting of the BRICS

• Executive chairman of the BRICS Media Forum He Ping, also president and editor-in-chief of Xinhua News Agency, presides over the "5th Presidium Meeting of the BRICS Media Forum" was held virtually. The countries exchanged information from the economic issues to public health issues during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Three Warmest Year Ever Recorded:

• "State of the Global Climate 2020" Interim report released by the United Nations World Meteorological Organization (UN-WMO) based on the temperature data from January-October (of 2020), the year 2020 is set to be among one of the Three Warmest Years Ever recorded.2020 becomes the 2nd warmest year followed by 2016.

Oman - recently announced to establish 'friendship' association with India

- This was the first of such initiative from West Asia.
- The bilateral discussion was held virtually on the backdrop of recent trip by the External Affairs Minister of India S Jaishankar to Bahrain and UAE.

UN CND removes Cannabis from "Most Dangerous Drug" Category

• In the Ongoing 63rd session of the United Nations Commission on Narcotic Drugs (UN-CND), Cannabis has been removed from the "Most Dangerous Drug" category. It is removed after UNCND voted to remove cannabis and cannabis resin from Schedule IV of the 1961 Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, decades after they were first placed on the list.

World's tallest mountain as 8,848.86m (29,031.7ft)

- China and Nepal have jointly determined the height of the world's tallest mountain as 8,848.86m (29,031.7ft).
- According to these countries which share a mountainous border, Mount Everest has risen almost 3 feet

Pfizer's vaccine debuts in UK as world's 1st fully tested shot

- United Kingdom became the first country in the world to offer a clinically authorised, fully tested vaccine to its people.
- Bahrain has become the second nation in the world to grant an emergencyuse authorisation for the coronavirus vaccine made by Pfizer and its German partner Bio-NTech
- Britain's National Health Service delivered its first shots of the Pfizer-BioNTech Covid-19 vaccine on December 8
- 90-year old Margaret Keenan, a former Jewellery shop assistant living in Coventry in central England, received the first shot of the Covid-19 vaccine

Iranian scientist's killed

• The assassination of Mohsen Fakhirzadeh a top Iranian nuclear physicist on November 27on the outskirts of Tehran has turned the spotlight back on Iran's nuclear programme.

India, Mongolia hold 7th Meeting of Joint Committee on Cooperation 2020

• On December 3, 2020 The 7th meeting of the India-Mongolia Joint Committee on Cooperation 2020 was held virtually. It was chaired jointly by Dr. S. Jaishankar, External Affairs Minister, India & Mr. L. Oyun-Erdene, Minister and Chief Cabinet Secretary, Government of Mongolia.



INDIA & OTHER COUNTRIES

India - has voted in favour of a move by the UN Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND)

- To remove cannabis from Schedule IV of the 1961 convention
- The decision to reclassify cannabis and drop it from the most strict drug control list of Schedule I followed a recommendation by WHO for a change in the scope of control of cannabis and cannabis-related substances.
- The decision was related to possible medical uses of cannabis and recommendations by WHO.
- Around 50 countries in the world have legalized the medicinal usage of cannabis
- The usage of Cannabis in India is governed by the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985.

India, US signs MoU on Intellectual Property Cooperation

• Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) and the United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to increase cooperation between India and the US on Intellectual Property (IP).

India-Japan Cyber Security Pact

• In October, 2020 During the External Affairs Minister Jaishankar's visit to Japan, both countries finalized the text of Cybersecurity pact which is expected to promote the Cooperation in sectors such as 5G, Internet of Things (IoT), Artificial Intelligence (AI).

APPOINMENTS

Ramesh Pokhriyal constitutes Task Force to impart Technical Education in Mother Tongue

• Union Minister of Education, Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank' constituted a Task Force for preparing a blueprint on imparting Technical Education in Mother Tongue. The Task Force will be headed by Secretary of Higher Education (Amit Khare).

First Dronacharya Awardee

• Srinagar born Wushu coach and the first Dronacharya Awardee from the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, Kuldeep Handoo is appointed as the Ambassador of Fit India movement.



SCHEMES

'Karpom Ezhthuvom Iyakkam'

- The Directorate of non-formal and adult education had recently launched a new scheme 'Karpom Ezhthuvom Iyakkam'.
- The initiative aims to provide literacy to illiterate 'aged' people.
- At present, 712 odd people in Adavathur Panchayat in Trichy district were encouraged by government school teacher to get back to learning.
- Under Puthiya Vayathu vanthor kalvi thittam an adult literacy programme, illiterates above the age of 15 are identified in every village and trained to put their signature besides being taught to read and write.

"Orunodoi" Scheme

- Assam CM Sarbananda Sonowal launches "Orunodoi" Scheme.
- The scheme is allocated with an annual budget of Rs. 2400 crore to provide financial assistance to socio- economically weaker sections for a period of 5 years.

Swasthya Sathi Scheme

• West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee extended the state's Health Insurance scheme "Swasthya Sathi Scheme" to cover the entire population of the state.

'Atmanirbhar Bharat Rozgar Yojana'

- Under the scheme, the government will contribute to the EPFO on behalf of both employee and employer for two years, for recruitments made between October 1, 2020 and June 30, 2021.
- The scheme will benefit nearly 58.5 lakh employees.

COMMITTEES

Apex Committee for Implementation of 2015 Paris Agreement

• The Government of India (GoI) has constituted a 17 members committee namely "Apex Committee for Implementation of Paris Agreement (AIPA)" under the chairperson of secretary, Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC)(Presently – Mr.Rameshwar Prasad Gupta).



COURT VERDICT

Chennai - Salem 277- km eight greenfield corridor project

- The Supreme Court upheld the notification to acquire farmlands, and allowed Centre to proceed with the Chennai-Salem 277-km eight-lane greenfield corridor project
- The eight-lane highway (NH179A and NH179B) is a part of the first phase of the 'Bharatmala Pariyojna' project
- It stretches across 24,800 km and has an estimated outlay of ₹5.35 lakh crore
- The highway intends to cut travel time for freight and passenger movement between Chennai and Salem by half

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

10th National Science Film Festival 2020

• The 10th National Science Film Festival 2020 was jointly organised by VigyanPrasar, an autonomous agency under the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India and the Tripura State Council of Science and Technology, Government of Tripura.

World's Oldest Nanostructures Found In 6th-Century BC Pottery from Keeladi, Tamil Nadu

- Scientists have discovered the oldest known human-made nano-materials in the "unique black coatings" of ancient pottery shards dated to **600 BC** that were unearthed from an archeological site in Keeladi, Tamil Nadu.
- The research was published in the journal Scientific Reports and the findings have been documented in a paper published in "Nature".

IAF carries out firing of surface – to – Air Missiles

• The Indian Air Force (IAF) carried out the Firing of Indigenously developed Akash Missile System (Surface – to – Air Missile) & Russian – Origin short – Range Igla Missile (Surface – to – Air Missile) as part of a drill which took place at Air Force station in Suryalanka, Andhra Pradesh.

China - second country to plant national flag on the moon

- China's National flag was unfurled from the Chang'e-5 spacecraft on the Moon, as per a photo released by China National Space Administration (CNSA) on December 4
- The US Planted the first flag on the moon during the manned Apollo 11 mission in 1969.



Australian Square Kilometre Array Pathfinder (ASKAP)

- It is a new type of radio telescope developed by Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO).
- It creates high-resolution images by combining the signals of 36 smaller dish antennas, each of 12 metre in diameter.

China launches Gaofen-14 - Earth Observation Satellite from XSLC

• China National Space Administration (CNSA) successfully launched Gaofen-14, a New Earth Observation Satellite from the Xichang Satellite Launch Centre (XSLC) in Southwest China's Sichuan province. The Satellite was sent into orbit by Long March-3B/G5 Carrier Rocket. This was the first use of the G5 version of the Long March-3B launch vehicle which features a longer fairing.

SpaceX Launched New Next-Generation Dragon Cargo Ship To ISS

• On 6th December 2020, SpaceX launched its 21st Commercial Resupply Services mission (CRS-21) to International space station (ISS) from the Launch Complex 39A (LC-39A) at Kennedy Space Center, Florida.
