TAMIL NADU

➤ **Demonstration Fast Reactor Fuel Reprocessing Plant (DFRP)**

- ✓ Prime Minister Narendra Modi dedicated the Rs 400 crore Demonstration Fast Reactor Fuel Reprocessing Plant (DFRP) at the Indira Gandhi Centre for Atomic Research (IGCAR), Kalpakkam, to the nation.



- ✓ The DFRP boasts a unique design, crafted entirely by Indian scientists.
 - ✓ This facility is capable of reprocessing both carbide and oxide fuels discharged from fast reactors, setting it apart as the only one of its kind globally.
 - ✓ This facility is a significant step towards advancing India's nuclear capabilities, designed to reprocess fuel from Prototype Fast Breeder Reactors (PFBR).
- **First Asia GCC Outside China In Tamil Nadu**
- ✓ Adidas, the renowned athletic footwear and apparel giant, is making strategic moves to enhance its global operations by establishing its first and only Global Capacity Centre (GCC) in Asia outside of China.



- ✓ This significant development underscores the growing trend of multinational corporations choosing India as a prime destination for setting up their GCCs, capitalizing on the country's abundant software skills.

- ✓ This move signifies a pivotal step for Adidas, as the Chennai facility becomes the first GCC outside of China in Asia.
- ✓ The choice of Chennai as the location for this hub reflects the city's rising prominence in the global corporate landscape.
- **Vinfast to build an integrated electric vehicle facility in Tamil Nadu**
- ✓ Vietnamese electric vehicle (EV) manufacturer VinFast on Saturday said it will work towards building an integrated EV facility in the state with a total investment of up to \$2 billion.



- ✓ The company, in a statement, said that it has committed \$500 million for the first phase of the project and that the total outlay will span five years from the commencement date.
- **Tata Power Company to invest nearly Rs 70,000 crore in Tamil Nadu**
- ✓ In what may well be the largest single investment by Tata Power Company in any state, the power major is all set to invest around Rs 70,000 crore to come up with 10 gigawatt (GW) solar and wind units in Tamil Nadu over a period of five to seven years.



- ✓ TP Solar's manufacturing plant is expected to start commercial production of cells and modules by FY25.

➤ **Global Investors Meet - GIM2024**

- ✓ The Tamil Nadu government, led by Chief Minister MK Stalin, revealed its ambitious vision for the state to achieve a \$1 trillion economy by 2030 during the Global Investors Meet in Chennai on January 7.



- ✓ It strategically aims for \$3.8-4.3 trillion in investments to attract FDI and boost local expansion. The goal is holistic growth, ensuring prosperity across all regions with a focus on climate consciousness and sustainability in all initiatives.
- ✓ Priorities include human capital growth, innovation through industry-academia partnerships, fostering an industry-friendly climate, advocating transparent governance, and developing sustainable infrastructure.

➤ **Technology Education and Learning Support (TEALS)**

- ✓ In an effort to bridge the digital divide, the School Education Department has partnered with Microsoft to expand the Technology Education and Learning Support (TEALS) programme to more schools on Thursday.



- ✓ The project was started on a pilot-basis in 14 schools of three districts – 10 government schools, two government-aided schools and two private schools.
- ✓ Now, the project is in the process of being expanded to 100 schools.

- ✓ The teachers have been trained to teach the students HTML, C++, Python, game development and artificial intelligence (AI).

➤ **Nalam Naadi App**

- ✓ Minister for School Education Anbil Mahesh Poyyamozi unveiled the *Nalam Naadi* app on Tuesday for special educators to track students with learning disabilities in Chennai.



- ✓ The students undergo health screening which is undertaken by the teachers at the school.
- ✓ This data is then fed into the health app under the Education Management Information System (EMIS) which is run by the School Education department.
- ✓ Hence, to be able to cater to the children's needs and to tailor a curriculum that would be beneficial for them, this app was launched".

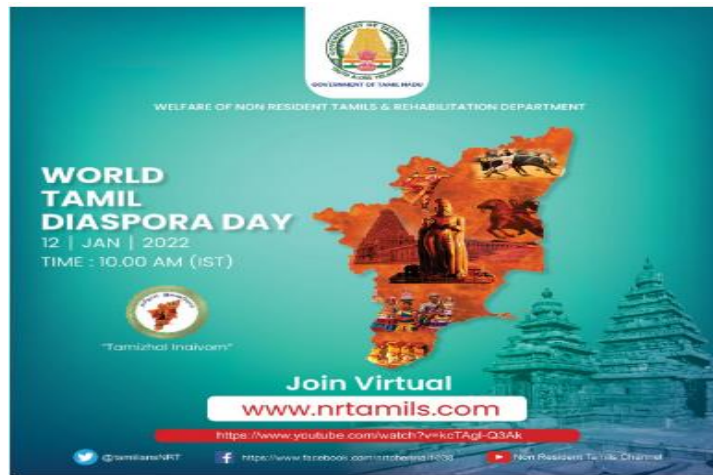

➤ **T.N. has the highest number of Operational SEZs**

Tamil Nadu has the highest concentration of Special Economic Zones (SEZs) in the country, with 54 in operation in the State, which account for a third of its exports, Alex Paul Menon, Development Commissioner, MEPZ (Madras Export Processing Zone) SEZ, said at the Global Investors Meet on Monday.

➤ First State To Map All Accident Prone Sites

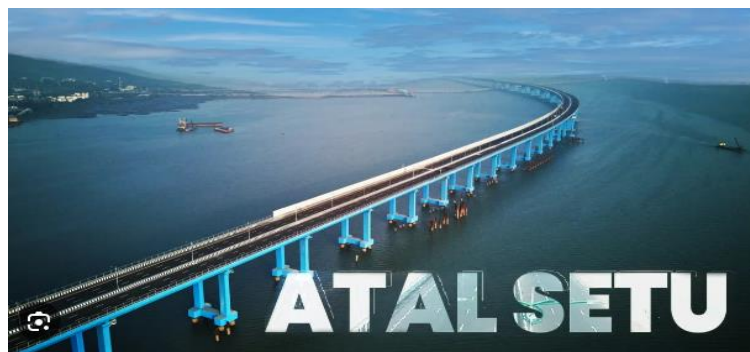
- ✓ Punjab has become the first in India to meticulously map all 784 accident black spots using the Mappls App, a cutting-edge navigation system developed by MapMyIndia.



- ✓ In a strategic move, the Punjab Police has teamed up with MapMyIndia to integrate real-time traffic updates and alerts into the Mappls App.
- ✓ This collaboration aims to provide citizens with crucial information about black and blind spots, ensuring a safer driving experience.
- ✓ The comprehensive mapping of accident black spots is a crucial component of this visionary project, aiming to create a robust system for ensuring road safety across the state.

➤ India's Longest Sea Bridge

- ✓ The Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL) or Atal Setu, longest sea bridge in India is set to be inaugurated by the prime minister Narendra Modi.



- ✓ The bridge has been named after former prime minister and late BJP veteran Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

- ✓ 21.8 km in length and having six lanes, the bridge has been constructed at a whopping cost of 18,000 crore.
 - ✓ The bridge originates from Sewri in Mumbai and ends at Nhava Sheva in Uran taluka in Raigad.
 - ✓ It is expected to boost economic development in Navi Mumbai and other nearby areas.
 - ✓ It has shortened the distance between Mumbai and Navi Mumbai to just 20 minutes which earlier took 2 hours.
- **World's First 'Black Tiger Safari'**
- ✓ In a groundbreaking move, Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has unveiled plans for the establishment of the world's first 'black tiger safari' near the Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR) in Mayurbhanj.



- ✓ This visionary project aims to provide tourists and visitors with a rare glimpse of the melanistic tigers, commonly known as black tigers, recently spotted at the Similipal National Park.
- ✓ The proposed safari site, near Baripada and spanning 200 hectares, will be strategically located adjacent to National Highway 18.

➤ 'Heal in India, Heal by India' Initiative

- ✓ India aims to extend medical facilities worldwide through the initiative, aligning with the philosophy of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam.



- ✓ Schemes like Ayushman Bharat demonstrate India's commitment to fostering equality in healthcare.
 - ✓ Inauguration of new facilities, including emergency wards and sports injury centers, highlights the government's dedication to enhancing healthcare infrastructure.
- **India's First Hygienic Food Street 'Prasadam'**
- ✓ Union Health Minister Dr Mansukh Mandaviya recently inaugurated 'Prasadam,' the nation's first healthy and hygienic food street, in a grand ceremony at Neelkanth Van, Mahakal Lok, Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh.



- ✓ Spanning an impressive 939 square meters, "Prasadam" stands as a symbol of holistic development.
- ✓ "Prasadam" goes beyond offering a culinary delight. It provides an array of facilities, including a dedicated kids' play area, drinking water facility, CCTV surveillance, ample parking, public conveniences, and spacious seating areas.

- ✓ These facilities are aimed at enhancing the overall experience for visitors and locals alike.
- **National Youth Festival**
- ✓ Prime Minister will inaugurate the 27th National Youth Festival at Nashik in Maharashtra tomorrow.



- ✓ He will also address the youth of the nation.
- ✓ National Youth Day is celebrated every year to honour the ideals and thoughts of Swami Vivekananda.
- ✓ The theme of the National Youth Festival this year is MYBharat-ViksitBharat@2047- By the Youth, For the Youth.
- ✓ During the celebration, various states will showcase cultural programmes of their diverse cultural heritage.
- **India's First Dark Sky Park**
- ✓ The Pench Tiger Reserve (PTR) in Maharashtra is India's first Dark Sky Park within a tiger reserve for earmarking areas around the park that restrict light pollution for stargazers to access pristine dark skies.



- ✓ Dark Sky Place certification focuses on lighting policy, dark sky-friendly retrofits, outreach and education, and monitoring the night sky.

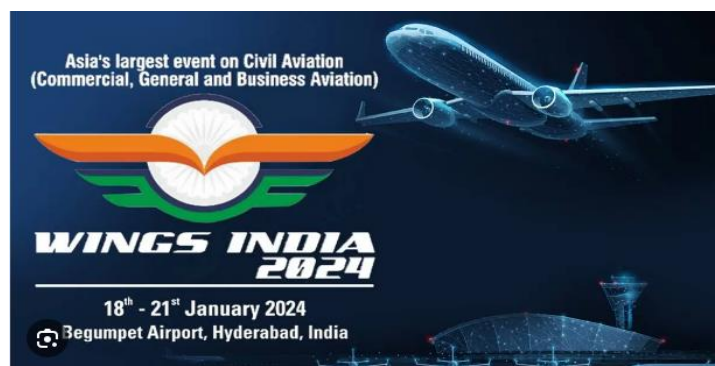
- ✓ This designation positions PTR as a sanctuary where tourists can witness celestial spectacles, shielded from the intrusion of artificial light pollution.
- ✓ Pench Tiger Reserve became the fifth such park in Asia.
- ✓ The certification was given by the International Dark-Sky Association, a global dark-sky movement to promote astronomy.

➤ **9th India International Science Festival**

- ✓ Minister of State for Science and Technology Dr. Jitendra Singh will inaugurate the 9th India International Science Festival in Faridabad, Haryana.



- ✓ The primary objective of this festival is to commemorate the world of science, making it accessible to all. It will continue till 20th January, which aims to engage the public with science and celebrate the joy of science.
 - ✓ From the ground-breaking Mars Orbiter Mission to the awe-inspiring Chandrayaan expeditions, India is not just keeping pace with technological advancements, it is leading the charge.
- **Asia's Largest Aviation Expo 'Wings India 2024'**
- ✓ Union Minister for Civil Aviation Shri Jyotiraditya M Scindia inaugurated Wings India 2024, Asia's largest aviation expo, at Begumpet Airport in Hyderabad.

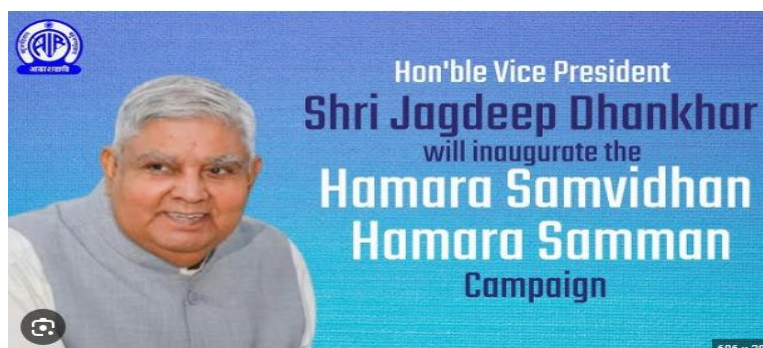

- **Farsi As India’s New Classical Language**
- ✓ In a noteworthy development aimed at strengthening cultural ties, the Government of India, under the New Education Policy, has decided to include Farsi (Persian) as one of the nine classical languages of India.



- ✓ This announcement was made by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar during a two-day visit to Iran, highlighting the cultural, literary, and linguistic connections between Iran and India.
- ✓ Farsi, also known as Persian, is an Indo-Iranian language belonging to the Iranian branch of the Indo-Iranian languages.

- **‘Hamara Samvidhan, Hamara Samman’ Campaign**
- ✓ Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar inaugurates 'Hamara Samvidhan, Hamara Samman' campaign for India's 75th Republic Year at Dr Ambedkar International Centre.



- ✓ The nationwide initiative aims to reinforce commitment to constitutional principles, instilling pride and responsibility among citizens.
- ✓ Nyaya Setu, introduced by the Vice-President, is a transformative initiative providing legal services to the last mile, with a focus on empowering marginalized communities.
- ✓ The campaign emphasizes legal empowerment, ensuring access to justice for all citizens.



SCHEMES

➤ PRITHVI VIGYAN Scheme

- ✓ The Indian government, under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has launched an ambitious initiative named PRITHVI (PRITHvi Vlgyan), a comprehensive scheme by the Ministry of Earth Sciences.



- ✓ With a significant budget of Rs. 4,797 crore, the program spans from 2021-26, marking a new era in the study and understanding of Earth sciences in India.
- ✓ The PRITHVI scheme aims to revolutionize our understanding and interaction with various Earth systems. Its objectives include: Strengthening the continuous monitoring of the Earth's atmosphere, oceans, geosphere, cryosphere, and solid earth to track and record essential changes.

➤ Mulya Pravah 2.0

- ✓ In a significant move to promote ethical practices in higher education, the University Grants Commission (UGC) of India has introduced Mulya Pravah 2.0.



- ✓ This new guideline comes as a response to surveys that highlighted unethical practices such as favouritism, sexual harassment, and gender discrimination within various educational organizations.

- ✓ Mulya Pravah 2.0 is an updated version of the original Mulya Pravah guideline, which the UGC introduced in 2019.
 - ✓ The main objective of this revised guideline is to instill human values and professional ethics in higher education institutions across India.
- **ANUBHAV Awards Scheme, 2024**
- ✓ The ANUBHAV Awards Scheme, initiated by the Department of Pension and Pensioners Welfare (DoPPW), is an innovative platform for recognizing the contributions made by retired officials to nation-building during their tenure in government service.



- ✓ Launched in 2015, the scheme is a step towards documenting India's administrative history through written narratives by retired Central Government employees.
 - ✓ The scheme offers 05 ANUBHAV Awards and 10 Jury Certificates annually.
- **Pradhanmantri Suryodaya Yojana**
- ✓ PM Modi Launches Sunrise Scheme To Install Solar Panels In 10 Million Households.



- ✓ The initiative, named 'Pradhanmantri Suryodaya Yojana,' seeks to propel India towards self-reliance in the energy sector while benefitting the common citizens.

- ✓ The initiative is poised to empower households across India by enabling them to generate their electricity through rooftop solar systems.
- ✓ By installing solar panels on one crore houses, the government aims to alleviate the financial burden on the poor and middle class while fostering sustainability and self-sufficiency in the energy domain.



INTERNATIONAL

- **International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC)**
- ✓ INSTC is a 7,200-km long multi-mode network of ship, rail, and road routes.



- ✓ The route primarily involves moving freight from India, Iran, Azerbaijan, and the Russian Federation via ship, rail, and road.
- ✓ The primary objective of the INSTC project is to reduce costs in terms of time and money over the traditional route currently being used.
- ✓ INSTC facilitates smoother transportation of goods, fostering economic growth and enhancing connectivity between the member countries.

INDIA & OTHER COUNTRIES

➤ **India-Guyana Hydrocarbon Collaboration**

- ✓ Union Cabinet, led by the PM, greenlights MoU between India's Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas and Guyana's Ministry of Natural Resources.



- ✓ Comprehensive collaboration covers crude oil sourcing, exploration, and production, oil refining, capacity building, bilateral trade, natural gas sector, regulatory framework, and clean energy initiatives.
- ✓ Anticipated strengthening of bilateral trade, investment facilitation, diversified crude oil sources, global exposure for Indian companies, and alignment with India's "Aatmanirbhar Bharat" vision.
- ✓ MoU set for an initial five-year term.

CONFERENCES & SUMMITS

➤ International Purple Fest 2024

- ✓ The International Purple Fest – Goa 2024, India's inaugural inclusive festival for persons with disabilities, kicked off today and is set to captivate audiences until January 13.



- ✓ The festival, organized by the Office of the State Commissioner of Persons with Disabilities, Government of Goa, and supported by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, showcases unity and diversity in a spectacular display.
 - ✓ The Opening Ceremony boasts engaging music, dance, and entertainment performances by Persons with Disabilities, symbolizing their remarkable talents.
 - ✓ With an expected global turnout of over 8,000 delegates, the International Purple Fest promises to be a global celebration of diversity, inclusivity, and empowerment.
- **9th NAM Summit In Kampala, Uganda**
- ✓ External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar recently provided a glimpse into the 19th Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) Summit, which commenced in Uganda.



- ✓ The two-day summit, under the theme 'Deepening Cooperation for Shared Global Affluence,' brings together over 120 developing countries, signifying a crucial moment in history.
- ✓ The Non-Aligned Movement (NAM), founded in 1961 during the Cold War based on the Panchsheel principle, traces its roots back to the concept that emerged in 1955 at the Asia-Africa Bandung Conference in Indonesia.



DEFENCE

➤ Desert Cyclone 2024

- ✓ The collaborative military exercise 'Desert Cyclone 2024' between India and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) is scheduled to take place in Rajasthan from January 2 to January 15.

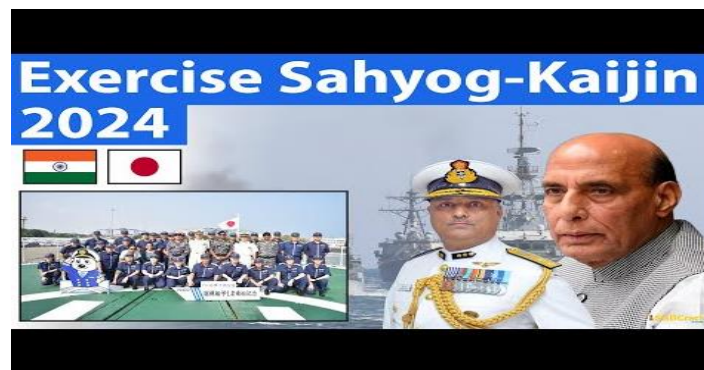


- ✓ This joint manoeuvre aims to enhance interoperability through the exchange of knowledge and best practices, particularly in urban operations.
 - ✓ The robust friendship between India and the UAE is deeply rooted in enduring cultural, religious, and economic interactions that span millennia.
 - ✓ In recent times, the collaboration in defence between India and the UAE has witnessed significant enhancement.
- **Exercise Sea Dragon 24**
- ✓ The Indian Navy marked its presence in the Pacific, on January 9th, 2024, with the arrival of a P-8I aircraft at Guam, USA.



- ✓ This deployment signals the navy's participation in the fourth edition of Ex Sea Dragon 24, an Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW) exercise spearheaded by the US Navy.

- ✓ Ex Sea Dragon 24 fosters collaboration and interoperability among the navies of the US, Australia, South Korea, Japan, and India.
 - ✓ The exercise aims to refine coordination and communication through professional interactions both on the ground and in the air, as per the Indian Navy's official statement.
- **Joint Exercise 'Sahyog Kaijin'**
- ✓ The Indian and Japanese Coast Guards have recently conducted a successful joint exercise named 'Sahyog Kaijin' off the coast of Chennai.



- ✓ This exercise is a part of the ongoing collaboration between the two countries under the Memorandum of Cooperation (MoC) signed in 2006.
- ✓ The joint exercise, which commenced on January 8, focused on enhancing interoperability and sharing best practices in maritime law enforcement, search and rescue operations, and pollution response at sea.
- ✓ The exercise underscores the strong maritime cooperation between India and Japan and aids in further strengthening their ties and mutual understanding.

➤ **'Ugram', Indigenous Assault Rifle**

'Ugram', an assault rifle developed by the Defence Research & Development Organization (DRDO) in collaboration with a private firm was launched.



- ✓ The weapon, developed at the Armament Research and Development Establishments (ARDE), the DRDO's Pune-based laboratory, is designed to meet the Indian Army's 'GSQR' (General Staff Qualitative Requirement) of a rifle weighing less than four kg.
 - ✓ The operational prototype of the 7.62 x 51mm assault rifle was unveiled by Dr S V Gade, director general (Armament & Combat Engineering Cluster).
- **Astra Missile**
- ✓ Union Minister of State for Defence, Ajay Bhatt, marked a historic moment on January 14, by flagging off the indigenously developed Astra air-to-air missiles.



- ✓ The Astra missile, a beyond visual range (BVR) air-to-air missile, stands as a testament to India's technological prowess.
 - ✓ Developed by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and manufactured by BDL for the IAF, the Astra Weapon System boasts unparalleled capabilities in its category, with a remarkable range exceeding 100 kilometers.
- **Ex-Ayutthaya**
- ✓ In a historic move, the Indian Navy and Royal Thai Navy (RTN) joined forces for the maiden bilateral exercise named 'Ex-Ayutthaya' in December 2023.



- ✓ 'Ex-Ayutthaya' translates to 'The Invincible One,' emphasizing the historical and cultural links between Ayodhya and Ayutthaya.
- ✓ This maritime collaboration, symbolizing the invincible spirit, holds profound significance as it connects the ancient cities of Ayodhya in India and Ayutthaya in Thailand.
- ✓ The Indian Naval ships Kulish and IN LCU 56 engaged in the inaugural edition, while His Thai Majesty's Ship (HTMS) Prachuap Khiri Khan represented the Royal Thai Navy.

➤ **Operation Sarvashakti**

- ✓ In response to escalating terrorist activities in Jammu and Kashmir, the Indian Army is launching Operation Sarvashakti, a strategic initiative aimed at curbing the influence of Pakistani proxy terrorist groups.



- ✓ This operation seeks to eliminate terrorists operating in the sensitive Rajouri Poonch sector.
 - ✓ Operation Sarvashakti aims to conduct combined counter-terrorist operations on both sides of the Pir Panjal ranges.
 - ✓ The Srinagar-based Chinar Corps and the Nagrota-headquartered White Knight Corps will execute simultaneous operations to neutralize terrorist threats.
- ### ➤ **Exercise KHANJAR**
- ✓ The 11th edition of the India-Kyrgyzstan Joint Special Forces Exercise KHANJAR has kicked off at the Special Forces Training School in Bakloh, Himachal Pradesh.



- ✓ Scheduled to take place from 22nd January to 3rd February 2024, this annual event has become a crucial platform for fostering collaboration and enhancing the capabilities of both nations' special forces.
- ✓ The primary aim of the exercise is to facilitate the exchange of experiences and best practices in Counter-Terrorism and Special Forces Operations.
- **Exercise 'CYCLONE'**
- ✓ The Indian Army contingent comprising 25 personnel reached Egypt to take part in the 2nd edition of India-Egypt Joint Special Forces Exercise CYCLONE.



- ✓ The Exercise will be conducted at Anshas, Egypt from 22nd January to 1st February 2024.
- ✓ The 2nd edition of Exercise CYCLONE commences, featuring a contingent of 25 Indian Army personnel from The Parachute Regiment (Special Forces) alongside Egyptian counterparts.
- ✓ Aimed at familiarizing both sides with operating procedures in desert/semi-desert terrains.
- **EX- DESERT KNIGHT**
- ✓ On 23 Jan 2024, the Indian Air Force (IAF) conducted Exercise Desert Knight along with the French Air and Space Force (FASF) and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) Air Force.



- ✓ While the French participation included the Rafale fighter aircraft and a multi-role tanker Transport, the UAE Air Force fielded the F-16.
- ✓ These aircraft operated from the Al Dhafra air base in the UAE.
- ✓ The main focus of Exercise Desert Knight was on enhancing synergy and interoperability between the three Air Forces.

➤ EXERCISE SADA TANSEEQ

- ✓ The inaugural joint military exercise, Sada Tanseeq, between the armies of India and Saudi Arabia, is poised to commence in Rajasthan, showcasing a significant leap in bilateral relations between India and Saudi Arabia.



- ✓ Scheduled from January 29th to February 10th, 2024, Sada Tanseeq signifies a landmark collaboration, epitomizing the growing strategic partnership between India and Saudi Arabia.

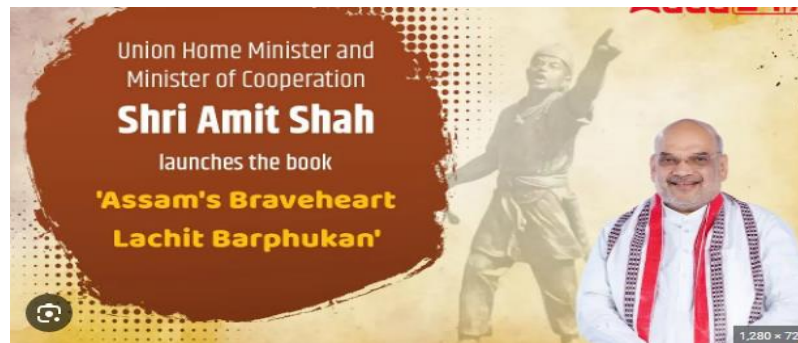
- ✓ Gen MM Naravane served as the 28th Chief of Army Staff, leading the Indian Army with distinction from December 2019 to April 2022.

- ✓ “Conversations with Aurangzeb” is a novel by Tamil literary icon Charu Nivedita, translated into English by Nandini Krishnan.



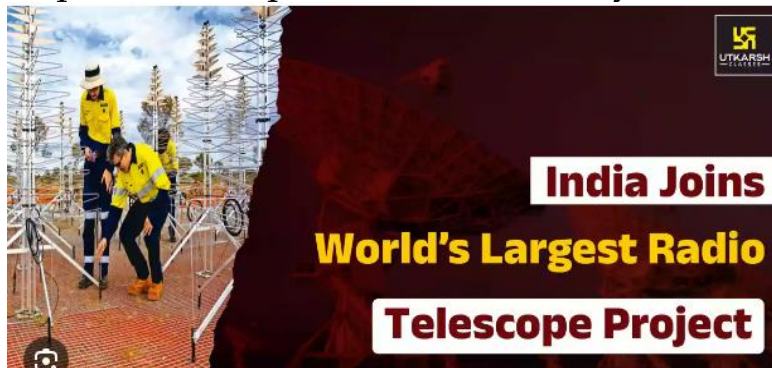
- ✓ This book represents a unique fusion of historical narrative and satirical commentary, offering readers a fresh perspective on both historical and contemporary themes.

SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY & ENVIRONMENT

- **Square Kilometre Array Observatory (SKAO)**
- ✓ India has become part of the largest radio telescope project in the world. Scientists in India will now be part of the Square Kilometre Array Observatory (SKAO).



- ✓ SKAO will function as the world's largest radio telescope.
 - ✓ SKAO is not a single telescope. It is an array of thousands of antennas.
 - ✓ The antennas will be installed in remote radio-quiet locations in South Africa and Australia.
 - ✓ India has taken part through the Pune-based National Centre for Radio Astrophysics (NCRA) and some other institutions.
- **Engineered Plant Cells To Produce Drug For Cancer**
 - ✓ Researchers from the prestigious Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) Madras and Mandi have successfully metabolically engineered plant cells to boost the production of the anti-cancer drug camptothecin (CPT).



- ✓ CPT, traditionally extracted from the endangered plant *Nathapodytes nimmoniana*, has been a source of concern due to the plant's declining population. The International Union for Conservation of Nature has red-listed this species, noting a 20% decrease in its population in the past decade.
- ✓ This development by IIT researchers comes as a critical solution to both medicinal production and plant conservation.

➤ **'E-Soil' That Accelerates Plant Growth**

- ✓ Scientists from laboratories of Linköping University in Sweden have unveiled an electrically conductive “soil” engineered to foster exceptional growth in crops, particularly barley seedlings, marking a potential 50 per cent surge in growth within a mere 15-day period.



- ✓ This innovative soilless cultivation method, termed hydroponics, harnesses a sophisticated root system activated through a novel cultivation substrate. With hydroponics, the prospect of cultivating food in urban landscapes under meticulously controlled conditions becomes a tangible reality.
- ✓ Their groundbreaking research highlights the remarkable acceleration in barley seedling growth by up to 50 per cent within a fortnight when their roots were electrically stimulated.

➤ **Cigaritis meghamalaiensis**

- ✓ After 33 years, a new species of butterfly has been discovered in the Western Ghats. A new species of Silverline butterfly, *Cigaritis meghamalaiensis*, has been discovered in Srivilliputtur Megamalai Tiger Reserve.



- ✓ In the last 33 years, this butterfly species has been found for the first time in the Western Ghats.
 - ✓ The newly identified species had been named after the region – Megamalai - meaning 'cloud mountain'.
 - ✓ The common name for this species was 'Cloud-forest Silverline'.
- **Disease X: Unveiling The Unknown Health Threat At WEF 2024**
- ✓ The World Economic Forum (WEF) 2024 kicked off on January 15 in Davos, Switzerland, where global leaders are slated to address a peculiar concern known as Disease X.



- ✓ This enigmatic term refers to an illness triggered by an unidentified yet potent microbial threat. A panel of the World Health Organization (WHO) is set to collaborate with other health officials to deliberate on this mysterious health menace.
 - ✓ Essentially, it represents an illness arising from an unknown but serious microbial threat, with COVID-19 serving as a tangible example.
- **India's First Indigenously Developed Hepatitis A Vaccine**
- ✓ Indian Immunologicals Ltd launched India's first indigenously developed Hepatitis A vaccine, **Havisure**.



- ✓ India's first indigenously developed Hepatitis A vaccine, **Havisure**, has been launched by a wholly-owned subsidiary of the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB), Indian Immunologicals Ltd (IIL).
- ✓ The vaccine is effective in preventing the Hepatitis A disease and is recommended for children in routine immunization. The Hepatitis A vaccine is used to prevent infection caused by the hepatitis A virus (HAV).
- ✓ Hepatitis A is a highly contagious liver viral infection. It mainly spreads through the ingestion of contaminated food or water.

➤ **'Anuvadini' App For Multilingual Education**

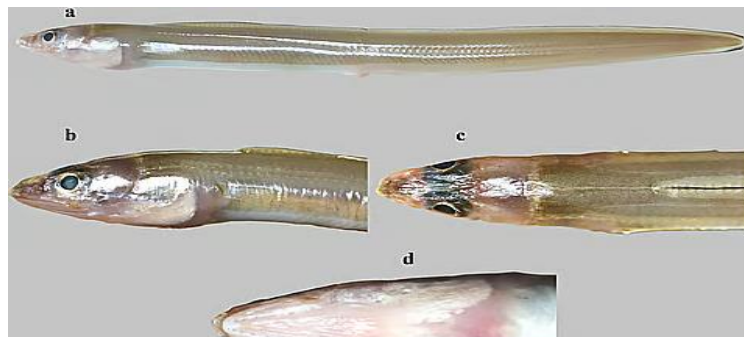
- ✓ In a significant move towards promoting multilingualism in education, the central government has introduced the 'Anuvadini' app, an Artificial Intelligence-based platform.



- ✓ The initiative aims to make study materials for all school and higher education courses available in digital form, specifically in Indian languages listed in the 8th Schedule of the Indian Constitution.
- ✓ This step aligns with the recommendations of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, emphasizing the importance of studying in one's mother tongue.

➤ **Two New Eel Species Discovered**

- ✓ Researchers from the National Bureau of Fish Genetic Resources (NBFGR) have discovered two new species of Congrid eels from the coasts of Tamil Nadu and Kerala.



- ✓ The species add to India's marine biodiversity knowledge in relatively less studied fish groups like eels.
- ✓ The eel found in the Gulf of Mannar has been named *Ariosoma kannani*, honoring the late Prof. L Kannan, renowned marine biologist from Annamalai University.
- ✓ The Kerala coast species is called *Ariosoma gracile* for its morphological traits.
- ✓ Taxonomically, both belong to the genus *Ariosoma* within the eel order Anguilliformes.



SPORTS

➤ India's First Multi-Sports Beach Games

- ✓ Madhya Pradesh became the overall champion in the first Beach Games held in Diu.



- ✓ India's first multi-sports Beach Games, "The Beach Games 2024" was held at the Blue Flag-certified Ghoghla Beach in Diu.
- ✓ Madhya Pradesh topped the medal tally with a total of 18 medals, including 7 gold. Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand, and hosts Dadra, Nagar Haveli, Diu, and Daman won 12 medals each.
- ✓ During this period, 1404 athletes under the age of 21 years from 28 states and union territories participated in a variety of sports with the support of 205 match officials.

➤ Pragganandhaa - India's No.1 Chess Player

- ✓ Rameshbabu Pragganandhaa, an 18-year-old chess prodigy from Chennai, achieved a historic milestone in his career by defeating World Champion Ding Liren from China.



- ✓ The win against Ding Liren not only marked a personal victory for Pragganandhaa but also led him to surpass the legendary Viswanathan Anand as the top-rated Indian player.

✓ With a FIDE live rating of 2748.3, Praggnanandhaa marginally edged past Anand's rating of 2748.

➤ **Khelo India Youth Games**

✓ The 13th edition of the Khelo India Youth Games was inaugurated with great enthusiasm by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi in Chennai, Tamil Nadu.



- ✓ The opening ceremony witnessed not only the commencement of the much-awaited sporting event but also the launch and foundation stone laying of significant projects in the Broadcasting sector, valued at around Rs 250 crores.
- ✓ The highlight of the ceremony was the lighting of the Games' torch, symbolizing the official inauguration of Khelo India Youth Games.

➤ **Dr. Nitya Anand**

- ✓ Dr Nitya Anand, who discovered India's first oral contraceptive pill 'Saheli', passed away at the age of 99.



- ✓ Anand was also the former director of the Central Drug Research Institute (CDRI) from 1974 to 1984.
- ✓ He was the brain behind the discovery of Centchroman', popularly known as 'Saheli.' It was the world's first and only non-steroidal, non-hormonal, once-a-week oral contraceptive pill.
- ✓ It was launched by then Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in 1986.
- ✓ In 2016, Saheli was incorporated in the National Family Programme of India.

➤ **Chennai Tops As Best City For Indian Women**

- ✓ Chennai emerged as the top Indian city for women in 2023 in terms of inclusivity and conduciveness to working women, as per findings from diversity, equity, and inclusivity consultant Avtar Group's Top Cities for Women in India (TCWI) 2023.



- ✓ Tamil Nadu cities topped both categories that the study covered – 49 cities in the million-plus population category and 64 cities in the less than a million-population category.

- ✓ The European Union's Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S) released its 2023 Global Climate Highlights report today, backing up scientific consensus that 2023 was the hottest year on record.
- ✓ The report shows 2023 had a global average temperature of 14.98 degree Celsius, which is 0.17 degree Celsius higher than 2016, the previous record-breaking year.
- ✓ It is also the first year with all days over 1 degree Celsius warmer than the pre-industrial period. She said, temperatures during 2023 exceeded those of any period in at least the last 100,000 years.
