TAMIL NADU

Car major Hyundai

✓ South Korean car major Hyundai – has rolled out its 10 millionth car in India from its factory in Sriperumbudur off Chennai

V.C. for Periyar University

✓ R Jagannathan – is appointed as the New vice-chancellor of Periyar University by Governor Banwarilal Purohit on June 30

King Institute

 Chief Minister M K Stalin - inaugurated the post-Covid care clinic at Government Covid Hospital on King Institute campus in Guindy, Chennai.

Vezham

✓ The forest department - is setting up an interpretation centre named 'Vezham' (elephant) at the government timber depot on Kotagiri Road in to create awareness about elephants among children.

Covid - Vaccination for pregnant Women

- ✓ Tamil Nadu began the vaccination drive for pregnant women for the first time in the country at **Pennadam** in Cuddalore district
- ✓ Pregnant women can opt for vaccination at any stage of their pregnancy after registration on Co-WIN portal or by walk-in registration at the nearest centre.
- The labour department has registered around 5 lakh migrant workers from other states in its 'online' portal, till now.
- Manali has become the first zone of the Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC) to have an all-women team to manage solid waste.

Cinematograph Act, 1952

- ✓ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin expressed his opposition to the Centre's proposed amendment to **the Cinematograph Act**, 1952.
- Three stone inscriptions and two base sculptures belonging to the 10th Century have been discovered in water bodies in and around Thesur village in Tiruvannamalai district.
- > Dindigul I Leoni Text Book Society head.
 - ✓ Dindigul I Leoni, a popular talk show host has been appointed head of the Tamil Nadu Textbook and Educational Services Corporation.
- > Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Art and Literature society for the Awards.
 - ✓ Chief minister M K Stalin presented cash awards and certificates to 21 writers for their best literary works in the fields of art, culture, literature and research activities
 - ✓ The literary luminaries were identified by the Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Art and Literature Society for the awards
 - ✓ The state government extends financial support to the Adi-Dravidar writers, for which a corpus fund of Rs. 50 lakh has been created.

- Tamil Nadu chief minister M K Stalin has sanctioned Rs. 1.25 crore assistance to the Tamil Chair from Cologne University in Germany
 - ✓ The timely financial assistance for the Tamil department in the University will prevent its closure due to a paucity of funds
 - ✓ The previous AIADMK government has also announced an assistance of Rs. 1.25 crore to the Tamil Chair in 2019.
- Tamil Nadu has only, one out of five, government schools in the state with internet facility.
 - ✓ Of the 37,579 government schools in the state, only 6,746 schools (17.9%) have internet facility
 - ✓ This was revealed in the Unified District Information System for Education Plus (UDISE+) report for 2019-20 released last week.
 - ✓ More than 80% government schools, however, have computer facility and most of them are functional.
 - ✓ The internet facility has become one of the basic requirements for learning due to online mode of education during the Covid-19 pandemic.
 - ✓ Among the 12,382 private schools in the state, 90% have computers and 75% have internet facility.
- The Navy has announced that the area within the 3km radius from the perimeter of INS Rajali naval air station in Arakkonam is a 'no fly zone'
 - ✓ According to DGCA, people have to register all drones with DiGi Sky platform and activate the 'No permission- No Take off' above 200ft altitude.
- The plan to set up India's first offshore desalination plant off the Chennai coast is to commence soon with the recent launch of the Rs 4,000 crore Deep Ocean Mission

PCV – Vaccine

- ✓ The Tamil Nadu government will launch the **Pneumococcal Conjugate** Vaccine (PCV) under universal immunisation programme.
- ✓ The initiative is expected to help reduce deaths due to pneumonia and meningitis among children below five.
- ✓ PCV will be provided free to children along with other vaccines under the universal immunisation programme.
- An all-party meeting in Chennai unanimously urged the Union government not to clear the Mekedatu dam project pushed by Karnataka
 - ✓ According to the CM, the proposed dam, with a capacity of 67.16tmcft, would affect the interests of Tamil Nadu farmers.

Doorstep Medical- as 'Makkalai Thedi Maruthuvam'

- ✓ Tamil Nadu Government to launch a doorstep medical care programme to offer homebased dialysis units to people with chronic renal failure.
- ✓ The initiative is named as 'Makkalai Thedi Maruthuvam'
- ✓ Initially, the state will launch a mass screening programme over the next 10 days to identify people with non-communicable diseases such as diabetes and hypertension in the state

- ✓ Later, those with diabetes or hypertension will undergo preliminary screening and consultation at PHCs.
- ✓ They will also carry **glucometers and BP apparatus** with them for routine screening.
- Justice A K Rajan had submitted a 165-page report to chief minister M K Stalin at the secretariat

Tamil Nadu government – will launch 47 industrial projects bringing in investments to the tune of Rs. 28,664 crore into the state

- ✓ These projects are expected to provide employment to 82,400 people in the state
- ✓ Out of the 47 projects, the state government will sign agreements for 35 new projects, with an investments worth over Rs.17,000 crore
- ✓ Further, the foundation stone for 9 other projects would be laid by Chief Minister M.K. Stalin.
- Chief Minister M K Stalin announced his government is working on a target to make Tamil Nadu a \$1 trillion (\$1 lakh crore) GDP economy by the year 2030.
 - ✓ The CM launched the DMK government's first major Industrial Conclave, organized by the Guidance bureau, after it came to power in May 2021
 - ✓ The state government has also unveiled an upgraded website 2.0 for single window clearance that has inculcated 100 more services across 24 departments
 - ✓ It is further planning to add 210 services under the initiative by next March
 - ✓ During the event, 35 new MoUs were signed in the presence of the CM to bring in more than Rs.17,141 crore in new investments and generate employment to 55,000 people.
 - ✓ In addition, foundation stones were laid for 9 new projects involving an investment of Rs.4,250 crore and generating employment to over 21,600 people
 - ✓ Further, the CM has inaugurated commercial production in 5 industrial units established with a combined investment of Rs.7,117 crore and employing close to 6,800 people.
- Tamil Nadu government has ordered the officials not to consider the salary and agriculture income while issuing the Other Backward Classes (OBC) certificates in the state
- 'Canine Parvovirus'
 - ✓ The State veterinary university has warned that several dogs in Chennai had started testing positive for the highly contagious 'canine parvovirus'

Rurban Mission

- ✓ The Union government is planning to construct a heritage village and tourism at Singaperumal Koil as part of efforts to promote rural tourism.
- ✓ Singaperumal Koil, located at 40km from Chennai, and six nearby villages Appur, Chettipuniyam, Guruvanmedu, Kolathur, Reddiplayam and Venkatapuram - are already notified as a cluster for implementing `Rurban' mission
- ✓ The mission aims to bridge the gap between urban and rural areas by providing economic, livelihood and physical infrastructure facilities in rural areas.
- ✓ Under the mission, women of the villages are brought together and are being provided training for livelihood. The mission says that the rural-urban divide in Tamil Nadu is 3.10%, much less than the national average.
- Tamil Nadu government has reconstituted the state-level vigilance and monitoring committee for SC/STs with chief minister M K Stalin as chairman.
 - ✓ Mr. Palanivel Thiagarajan (Finance),
 - ✓ N Kayalvizhi Selvaraj (adi dravidar welfare),
 - ✓ C V Ganesan (labour welfare)
 - ✓ M Mathiventhan (tourism)
 - ✓ It comprises of nine MPs, including VCK leaders Thol Thirumavalavan and D Ravikumar.
- The state government has decided to offer "Procurement Preference" to startups in public purchases, both products and services, by various government departments and connected organizations
 - ✓ According to the GO released, startups in Tamil Nadu are technically capable of providing solutions to governance and other issues faced by the departments in implementing schemes.
 - ✓ Providing procurement preference in varied segments IT, agritech and edutech to startups will also help them to develop rapidly and create enormous employment and wealth in the state.

'High Priority'-by TN Govt

- ✓ Tamil Nadu government has made mandatory for employees as well as their family members to take both doses of Covid-19 vaccine to access workplaces or industries, treating them as 'high priority' group
- ✓ Health inspectors who have completed courses in public health at recognised universities should ensure all staff members are screened at the workplace entrance.
- ✓ Besides measuring temperature, the health inspectors should record details of symptoms and history of family members testing positive in the past week.
- ✓ Staff having symptoms must be quarantined and referred to the nearest health facility for performing further tests and management.
- Tamil Nadu school education department is planning to train all 3 lakh teachers in government schools with basic functional computer skills
 - ✓ Each teacher will be trained for **five days on creating a word document**, **PDF**, **sending emails and on how to use online videos in classrooms**.
 - ✓ The training will be conducted in hi-tech labs in around 7,000 government high and higher secondary schools throughout the state.

- ✓ The teachers will also be trained on entering data on EMIS (Educational Management Information System) The EMIS is a government data repository with enrollment and other details of students across government-run schools in the state.
- ✓ The 'Resource Persons Training' will be launched by school education minister Anbil Mahesh Poyyamozhi on July 26.
- ➤ The Tamil Nadu government announced that it will implement 10.5% special reservation for vanniyars in admission to all courses, including professional courses, from the academic year 2021-22.
 - ✓ After consultation with legal experts and the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission (TNPSC), chief minister M K Stalin issued an order to implement the 10.5% special reservation from February 26, 2021
 - ✓ The previous AIADMK government had passed the legislation to temporarily provide for 10.5% special reservation for vanniyars within the 20% quota for most backward classes (MBCs).
- Chief Minister M K Stalin inaugurated 25 CNG (compressed natural gas) stations in Chennai and Tiruvallur and one main station of Gujarat-based Torrent Gas through video conferencing.
 - ✓ Torrent Gas plans to commission 50 CNG stations by September this year and 100 CNG stations by June next year and 500 by March 2023.
 - ✓ As per the plan, within the next year, at least 70,000 households in Chennai will be covered by PNG (piped natural gas) supply, which is a cheaper alternative to LPG cylinders.
 - ✓ At current prices, PNG is about 40 % cheaper than LPG.
- Chennai-based National Centre for Coastal Research (NCCR) deployed a buoy fitted with sensors off the coast of Puducherry
 - ✓ Based on the data, the NCCR team will also calculate the water quality index alongwith remedial measures to improve it, if needed
 - ✓ After the southwest monsoon ends in September, NCCR plans to deploy similar buoys off Visakhapatnam and Lakshadweep.
 - ✓ At present, it collects water samples manually in more than 22 locations along the 7,500km Indian coast every month to measure quality.

> Revival of MSMEs in the state govt

- ✓ The Tamil Nadu government -has constituted a 13-member expert committee for revival of MSMEs in the state.
- ✓ Former Industries secretary, Tamil Nadu government.
- ✓ The state government had promised to constitute such a committee "to formulate schemes for revival of MSMEs" in the Governor's address delivered to the state assembly on June 21, 2021.

The committee will include -

- ✓ Prof M Vijayabhaskar, part time member of State Development Policy Council,
- Bindu Anand, former member of RBI Committees on financial inclusion, SME finance and securitization,
- ✓ N Balasubramaniam, former CMD, SIDBI,
- ✓ Hemalatha Annamalai, co-founder and ex-CEO, Ampere Vehicles (evehicle),
- ✓ Israr Ahmed, regional chairman, FIEO,

- ✓ Anburajan, president, TANSTIA and
- ✓ R Anand, ex-partner, Ernst and Young and former member of RBI Committee on Asset Reconstruction Companies.
- The state government decided to bestow veteran Communist leader N Sankaraiah, who recently celebrated his 100th birthday, with the recently constituted 'Thagaisal Thamizhar' (Venerable Tamil) award.
 - ✓ Chief Minister M K Stalin will present the award to Sankaraiah at the Independence Day celebrations in Chennai on August 15.
 - ✓ The award carries a citation and a cheque for Rs.10 lakh.
 - ✓ Responding to the announcement and expressing his intent to accept the award, Sankaraiah thanked the CM for the recognition.
 - ✓ He however donated the Rs.10 lakh prize money to CM's Covid-19 Relief Fund
- Greater Chennai Corporation to launch the Rs. 180-crore air and water pollution mitigation programme in association with Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board
 - ✓ Under the programme, the civic body is planning to install ambient air quality monitoring systems (AAQMS) in 50 locations in the city.
 - ✓ The system would calculate the level of air pollutants such as PM2.5, PM10, SOx, NOx and carbon monoxide and display it on digital boards.
 - Further, wind augmentation and purifying units (WAYU) will be installed at 20 junctions in Chennai.
- Tamil Nadu Director-General of Police (DGP) C Sylendra Babu announced weekly dayoff to police personnel in the state in order to maintain their health and enable them to spend time with their family.
- American-based solar technology company First Solar Inc announced that it will invest \$684 million in a new, fully vertically integrated photovoltaic (PV) thin film solar module manufacturing facility in the state

Srivilliputhur sanctuary has the highest leopard density in Western Ghats: report

✓ The Srivilliputhur Grizzled Squirrel Wildlife Sanctuary in Tamil Nadu has the highest leopard density (per 100 sq km), not just in the State but in the entire Western Ghats landscape.

Phuket to be Chennai's sister city

- ✓ The city of Phuket in Thailand has proposed to establish a sister city agreement with Chennai.
- ✓ The Royal Thai Consulate-General in Chennai has requested the Greater Chennai Corporation to discuss various aspects of the sister city partnership.

> Denmark looks to set up centre for offshore wind in T.N.

- ✓ Denmark is keen on setting up a Centre of Excellence for Offshore Wind and believes that Tamil Nadu is the best place for it as wind patterns are consistent here.
- ✓ A location has also been identified, Danish Ambassador to India Freddy Svane.

New higher education panel formed; The Tamil Nadu State Council for Higher Education (TANSCHE) has been reconstituted by the government with the appointment

- ✓ Mr. Ramasamy, a former Vice-chancellor of Alagappa University, is a historian. He has written books on the language struggle and Dravidian politics.
- ✓ He had also served as the Vice-Chairman of TANSCHE from 2006 to 2011.
- ✓ The Council has been functioning without a Vice-Chairman since 2016.
- ✓ Mr. Krishnasamy was an associate professor of history in Pachaiyappa's College.
- ✓ While the Higher Education Minister will be the head of the Council, the Additional Chief Secretary from the Finance Department, Secretary to the Governor, Principal Secretary of the Higher Education Department, the Director of Collegiate Education, and the Director of Technical Education will be some of its ex-officio members.
- Centre grants relief package of 800 crore rupees to Tamil Nadu for Covid-19 management
 - ✓ Tamil Nadu Health Minister M. Subramaniam said that the Union Government granted a relief package of 800 crore rupees for management of the second wave and prevention of the third wave in the state.
- President Ramnath Kovind unveiled Karunanidhi's portrait in Tamil Nadu Assembly
 - ✓ President Ram Nath Kovind participated in an event commemorating the centenary year of the Madras Legislative Council and unveil a portrait of former Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M Karunanidhi inside the Assembly premises.

Study finds heavy metals in ambient air in city

✓ The presence of heavy metals, including nickel, manganese and silica, in the ambient air has technically put Chennai in the 'unhealthy' category.

Auto Insurance Scheme in Tamil Nadu Post Office

- ✓ A scheme to provide auto insurance has been launched at the Tamil Nadu Post Office.
- ✓ Accordingly, insurance is provided for two and four wheelers.

Class 9 student made palm sized CPU, Chief Minister Stalin praised

- ✓ SS Madhav, a Class IX student from Tiruvarur district of Tamil Nadu, has made a palmsized computer CPU. For this unique construction, Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin met
- ✓ SS Madhav and wished him all the best for this construction. Appreciating Madhav's work, Stalin assured Madhav of the state government's assistance for computer-related studies and research.

Stalin launches free COVID-19 vaccination through private hospitals using CSR funds

✓ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin launched a free COVID-19 vaccination drive through private hospitals, financially supported by their Corporate Social Responsibility Fund.

T.N. Open University begins excavation at Porpanaikottai

✓ Minister for Environment Siva V. Meyyanathan inaugurated the excavation works taken up by the Tamil Nadu Open University at Porpanaikottai village in Tiruvarangulam panchayat union in the district in a bid to unearth possible archaeological remains.

Recent Excavations -in Tamilnadu

Sivagalai Archaeological

- ✓ For the first time, a full human skeleton was discovered in one of urns found at the Sivagalai archaeological site on July.
- ✓ The second phase of excavation is underway at the site by the Tamil Nadu state department of archaeology
- ✓ It is being established under the guidance of the principal investigator department of genetics Dr G Kumaresan and eminent immunologist Dr R M Pitchappan.

Ra Ra Peruvazhi

- ✓ An 800-year-old stone inscription belonging to the reign of Rajaraja Chola I has been found in Nambuthalai near Thondi in Ramanathapuram district.
- ✓ Ra Ra Peruvazhi, is the name of the east coast highway laid during the period of Rajaraja Cholan.
- Archaeologists in Pudukkottai have discovered three rare Aasiriyam (declaration) stone tablets, dating back to the period between the 13th and 16th centuries
- The State Archaeology Department has discovered the remnants of a large ancient conch industry in Korkai in Tuticorin district
 - ✓ This is the site in which the Tamil Nadu State Archaeology Department conducted its first excavation, after it was established in 1969.
- A terracotta container with an intricately designed band running along its outer surface has been unearthed at the archaeological site at Keeladi in Sivaganga during the seventh phase of excavation
 - ✓ The ring wells unearthed in Keeladi, have an interlocking system where sand cannot enter the wells, but air and water could percolate through them.
 - ✓ It is believed that these structures helped inhabitants of Keeladi to have more permanent dwellings and as they had water and did not have the need to migrate during droughts.
- Archaeologists have discovered a rubble stone well at the Kodumanal site, close to the banks of river Noyyal near Chennimalai in Erode district
 - ✓ Earlier, ring wells and brick wells have been found in other archaeological sites in Tamil Nadu like Keezhadi in Sivagangai district
 - ✓ Archaeologists have found evidence for existence of iron smelting unit with furnaces in the site, besides urn burials, beads, pot shreds with brahmi inscriptions, aged 2,300 years.
 - \checkmark Kodumanal has yielded the highest number of pot sherds with Tamil brahmi inscriptions

Kodumanal site has copper, gold, iron and glass pieces as well as artefacts

✓ There were three types of burial methods – cairn circles, urn burials and urn burials with cists - found at Kodumanal site

Konthagi is burial site of Keeladi

- ✓ Archaeologists have identified seven human skeletons in a single quadrant in Konthagai in the Keeladi cluster. Keeladi is considered to have been the industrial hub of a 2,600-year-old civilization
- ✓ Its neighbouring villages of Konthagai, Agaram and Manalur are also treated as part of this civilization.
- ✓ At present, the seventh phase of excavation is taking place in Keeladi cluster
- ✓ The second phase of excavation is being carried out in the three neighbouring villages of Konthagai, Agaram and Manalur by the Tamil Nadu state department of archaeology
- ✓ As per the recent findings, Konthagai was supposed to be the burial site of the Keeladi civilization.

> A punch-marked silver coin - was located at the Keeladi excavation site in Sivaganga

- ✓ The discovery was announced by Archaeology minister Thangam Thennarasu
- ✓ The coin having the figures of the sun, moon, bull, taurine, an animal figurine, and geometric designs show that Keeladi inhabitants were a trading community.
- ✓ Located at a depth of 1.46 m, the punch-marked coin indicates the existence of trade between north and south, particularly with the Gangetic valley.
- ✓ During the ancient period, such silver punch-marked coins were in circulation from the time of Mahajanpadas of the 6th century BCE.
- ✓ Such coins have been recovered from excavations conducted at Alangulam also.

> Discovery of additional wall at Ariyalur Maligaimedu excavation

✓ The State Department of Archaeology has made some encouraging finds lower than two months into the excavation at Maligaimedu near Gangaikondacholapuram, the capital of King Rajendra Chola I.

Terracotta container with designs found in Keeladi

✓ A terracotta container, which has intricately designed bands around it, has been unearthed at the Keeladi archaeological site in TamilNadu.

Megalithic full-length sword unearthed

- ✓ The excavations at Mayiladumparai in Krishnagiri district have yielded a full-length iron sword broken at places.
- ✓ This is the first time the Department of Archaeology has unearthed a full-length sword with a handle in Tamil Nadu.
- ✓ The length is 60 cm.

Chola era temple in Velachery grabs government's attention

- ✓ Work to clean the precincts of Sri Vasudevaperumal temple at Ram Nagar in Velachery will be expedited.
- ✓ A large part of the temple is covered with thick layer of dirt.
- ✓ Minister for Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments P. Sekarbabu said that officials had been asked to dig out documents and any information relating to the temple.

Perforated terracotta distillation pipes unearthed in Korkai

✓ Nine perforated terracotta pipes, stacked one above the other, have been found during archaeological excavation at Korkai, an ancient site, in Thoothukudi district.

STATE

- Pushkar Dhami sworn in as Uttarkhand Chief Minister
 - ✓ Two-time MLA from Khatima in Uttarakhand, Pushkar Singh Dhami was sworn in as the 11th Chief Minister of the State along with an 11-member cabinet
- The Odisha State Cooperative Handicrafts Corporation Ltd has submitted the application for the geographical indication (GI) tag to the famous silver filigree of Cuttack
- > The first case of Zika virus was reported in the state of Kerala
 - ✓ A 24-year-old pregnant woman was found infected with the mosquito-borne Zika virus in the state.

> Ladakh – First Union Territory –to vaccinate.

- ✓ The first Union Territory to vaccinate all residents and the migrant labourers, hotel workers and Nepalese citizens who live there, with the first dose of Covid-19 jab.
- On July, the Assam cabinet announced the creation of a "Department of indigenous faith and culture" to protect the culture and practices of people belonging to tribal and other indigenous communities.

U.P Population Bill 2021

- ✓ The Yogi Adityanath government unveiled the policy on population control for 2021-30 on the occasion of the World Population Day on July.
- ✓ Uttar Pradesh has a total fertility rate of 2.7% currently, whereas it should ideally be less than 2.1%. The draft Uttar Pradesh Population (Control, Stabilization and Welfare) Bill, 2021 - is open for public suggestions in public domain till July
- ✓ The draft bill, among other provisions, seeks to provide incentives to couples who follow the two-child policy. .

Balika Panchyat

- ✓ Kunariya village in Kutch district in Gujarat to become the first village in the country to elect a **Balika Panchayat (Girls Council**)
- ✓ The panchayat is aimed at addressing issues around female adolescents of the girls, by the girls, for the girls and empower women in the village
- ✓ Young females from the village, aged between 10 and 21 years, will contest elections for this unique panchayat.
- ✓ This "girls only" council will run parallel to the adult village version, but only address issues pertaining to adolescent girls and women in the village.

Pariwar Aarthik Sahayata Yojana'

- ✓ The new scheme was notified by Department of Social Welfare recently.
- ✓ Under this scheme, Rs 50,000 ex gratia will be provided to every family who lost a member to Covid-19 infection.
- ✓ Further, an additional pension of Rs 2,500 per month will be provided to the family members, if the deceased was sole breadwinner of the family.
- ✓ Children who lost their both parents or one parent will also be provided Rs 2,500 per month till the age of 25 years alongwith the provision for free education.

- Telangana's Ramappa temple, also known as Rudreswara temple becomes the country's 39th world heritage site on July
 - ✓ The historic Rudreswara temple, an architectural marvel created in stone, became UNESCO's first world heritage site in Telangana
 - ✓ Located at Palampet in Mulugu district, the iconic temple was voted for inclusion in the world heritage sites' list at the 44th virtual session of the World Heritage Committee of the UNESCO, which is currently underway at Fuzhou in China
 - ✓ This temple is known as Ramappa temple, named after the sculptor who, for 40 years, executed the work in the temple.
- Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan virtually launched UNESCO's 'Historic Urban Landscape' project for 'Gwalior and Orchha' cities of the state through video conferencing recently.
- > Odisha's Puri becomes India's first city to provide 24x7 piped drinking water supply
 - ✓ Odisha chief minister Naveen Patnaik launched "Sujal Drink from Tap Mission" through a virtual platform
 - ✓ During the launch, the CM said Puri has joined international cities like London, New York and Singapore in supplying round-the-clock quality piped drinking water from taps.
- Karnataka home minister Basavaraj Bommai will be sworn in as the 23rd CM of the state on July
- Dholavira, a Harappan-era metropolis in the Kutch region of Gujarat declared as 'UNESCO World Heritage Site' (WHS) on July
 - ✓ The first representation for Dholavira's inscription was made in 2014 by the Government of India.
 - ✓ The ancient town, found in 1967 and excavated in 1989-90 for the first time, is the second biggest Harappan site after Rakhigarhi in India.
 - ✓ The formal announcement of Dholavira's new title was made during the ongoing 44th session of UNESCO's World Heritage Committee.
 - ✓ After Mohenjodaro in Pakistan, Dholavira is the second Harappan site to get the coveted tag in south Asia and the first from India.
- Uttar Pradesh has the maximum number of manual scavengers in the country (37,379 people), followed by Maharashtra (7.378) and Assam (4,295), based on two surveys carried out in 2013 and 2018

Pink Protection

✓ The Kerala Police launched a new initiative called the **Pink Protection** project for the protection of women in public, private and digital spaces.

- ✓ The delimitation commission to visit J&K from July 6 to July 9 to interact with political parties, public representatives and officials of the Union Territory
- ✓ The commission is headed by retired Supreme Court judge Ranjana Prakash Desai.

CCRISP – World bank

- ✓ The World Bank has approved a \$500 million programme to support India's informal workforce, including gig workers and migrants
- ✓ Of the total commitment, \$112.5 million will be financed by a credit from the International Development Association (IDA), World Bank's concessionary lending arm
- ✓ The latest assistance is granted further to the \$1.15 billion committed already by World Bank to support schemes in the country under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana
- ✓ This aid is offered as per a program called 'Creating a Coordinated and Responsive Indian Social Protection System (CCRISP)

Zycov – D Plasmid DNA Vaccine

Ahmedabad-based Zydus Cadila – has applied for emergency use authorisation (EUA) to the Drug Controller General of India for ZyCoV-D, its plasmid DNA vaccine against Covid-19

> Prevention, Care and Rehabilitation Bill, 2021

- ✓ The ministry of women and child development has released the draft of the Trafficking in Persons (Prevention, Care and Rehabilitation) Bill, 2021 in the public domain, asking for feedback till July
- ✓ The bill once finalised will need the Cabinet approval and assent of both Houses of Parliament to become a law.
- ✓ The new bill aims to tighten the punishment on traffickers and ensures a rehabilitation framework for survivors
- ✓ As per the new bill, any person committing an offence of "trafficking in persons" shall be punished with imprisonment not less than seven years but which may extend to ten years and shall also be liable to a fine of at least one lakh rupees.
- On July, Union AYUSH Minister Kiren Rijiju launched the Ayurveda dataset on the Clinical Trial Registry-India (CTRI) Portal
 - ✓ The Ayurveda Dataset of CTRI has been jointly developed by Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS) under the Ministry of Ayush.

The Coastal Shipping Service, Green Freight Corridor 2 was launched from Cochin port to Beypore and Azhikkal ports in Kerala

NIPUN Bharat

- ✓ The initiative will be undertaken by the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education.
- ✓ NIPUN is the short form for 'National Initiative for Proficiency in Reading with Understanding and Numeracy'

- ✓ The programme intends to provide an easily accessible environment for basic education and numerical knowledge.
- ✓ Under the initiative, every child will be provided the desired learning competencies in reading, writing and numeracy by the end of class 3, by 2026-27

'Financial Literacy Workbook' for Class 6 students

- ✓ The book has been prepared by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI).
- ✓ The book will be used in "Financial Literacy" subject offered as an elective subject for Class 6
- ✓ It has been designed to improve the student's knowledge in banking and payment areas.

➤ "ON TIME" GST Tax payers.

✓ On the eve of GST's 4th anniversary on July, the Union Ministry of Finance – announced that it will issue certificates of appreciation to around 54,439 GST taxpayers, who filed returns 'on time' and ensure 'prompt' cash payment of the tax

> DISCOM

- ✓ The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) has approved the Rs 3.03 trillion Power Distribution Company (DISCOM) reform scheme.
- ✓ The new scheme seeks to subsume programmes such as the Integrated Power Development Scheme and the **Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Gram Jyoti Yojana**.
- ✓ Under the scheme, it is proposed to install approximately 10 crore prepaid Smart Meters by December, 2023 in the first phase
- On July, the Department of Public Enterprises (DPE) was made part of the finance ministry
 - ✓ The move is intended to speed up the privatisation process and gain more control over state-run-enterprises
- Capital city, Delhi saw the most dramatic increase of 125% in the level of the key pollutant, nitrogen dioxide (NO2), during the same period between April 2020 and April 2021
- Union Minister for Road transport Nitin Gadkari inaugurated the country's first commercial liquified natural gas (LNG) filling station in Nagpur on July
- The 'Jal Shakti' (water resources) ministry had urged states to speed up rainwater conservation exercise by revitalising existing ponds and water bodies, and provisioning check dams
 - ✓ Earlier, under the 'Jal Shakti Abhiyan-1' of 2019, only 1,592 water-stressed blocks out of 2,836 blocks are covered in 256 districts of the country.
 - ✓ The latest assessment of 'dynamic groundwater resources' in India has shown a sign of improvement in 2020 compared to 2017.

LIC to be Privatised

- ✓ The Union Cabinet has approved the share sale of the state-run insurance giant, Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC).
- ✓ The government, which holds 100% equity holding in LIC, is planning to sell a portion of its stake in the process.

- ✓ LIC's IPO is expected to be the biggest in India with many analysts expecting a share sale in excess of Rs.1 lakh crore.
- ✓ It is part of the government's plan to raise Rs.1.75 lakh from asset sales in state run companies in the current fiscal year which ends in March.
- ✓ The government aims to complete strategic sale of Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL), Shipping Corp, Container Corporation, Neelachal Ispat Nigam Ltd, Pawan Hans and Air India, among others, by March 2022.
- ✓ Besides, IDBI Bank would be privatised in the current fiscal
- The centre had recently released Unified District Information System for Education Plus report (UDISE+) for 2019-2020.
 - ✓ UDISE+, which was launched in 2018-2019, is the largest Management Information Systems on school education.
 - ✓ It covers 1.5 million schools, 8.5 million teachers and 250 million children.
 - ✓ It is an advanced and improved version of UDISE that was launched in 2012-2013 by integrating DISE for elementary education & SEMIS for secondary education.
 - ✓ UDISE+ helps in measuring education parameters across classes 1 to 12 in government as well as private schools in India
- Serum Institute of India (SII) to commence the production of Russia's Sputnik V in the country in September 2021.

➤ "ShopSy"

✓ e-commerce major, Flipkart - has launched its new app called 'Shopsy' for facilitating online business.

➢ 66A- IT Act

- ✓ The Union Home Ministry has asked all states and Union Territories to instruct police stations not to register fresh cases under Section 66A of the Information Technology Act.
- ✓ The Supreme Court in its judgment on March 24, 2015 in the case of Shreya Singhal vs. Union of India, had scrapped Section 66A of the Information Technology Act, 2000 calling it "vague and arbitrary".
- ✓ According to the SC, the section was repealed for being violative of the right to free speech guaranteed under Article 19 of the Constitution) Under the scrapped Section 66A of the IT Act, a person posting offensive messages could be imprisoned for up to three years alongwith fine.
- ✓ The Centre has requested that if any case has been booked in states and UTs under section 66A of the IT Act, 2000, such cases should be immediately withdrawn.

The Union Cabinet - approved the extension of Rebate of State and Central taxes and Levies (RoSCTL) for exports of garments and made ups, without changing the rates.

Drone Rules 2021

- ✓ "Drone Rules, 2021" for seeking public comments by August 5, 2021
- ✓ Drone operators will have to generate a unique identification number of a drone by providing the required details on the digital sky platform.
- ✓ The draft Rules also mandates safety features such real-time tracking beacon, and geofencing, which are expected to be notified later
- ✓ Further, an interactive airspace map with green, yellow, and red zones is also proposed to be displayed on the digital sky platform.

➤ "Khadi"

- ✓ Khadi and Village Industry Commission (KVIC) has secured trademark registration for its brand name "Khadi" in three countries - Mexico, Bhutan and United Arab Emirates (UAE).
- The Centre has moved a proposal to amend the 102nd constitutional amendment Act, enacted in 2018, to restore state's power to decide OBCs
 - ✓ The proposal will overturn the May 5 Supreme Court judgment in the Maratha reservation case by a 5-judge Constitution Bench
 - ✓ As per the verdict, only the President can declare any community as OBC based on the recommendation of the National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC).
 - ✓ The proposal seeks to restore the rights of states to identify the OBCs for the "state list" of castes eligible for Mandal reservations in education and employment under state governments.
 - ✓ The 102nd Constitution Amendment adds two clauses in Article 342 as Article 324A on the President declaring any socially or educationally backward class, in consultation with the state governor.
 - ✓ The draft Bill was readied by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment
 - ✓ It seeks to add a clarification clause in Article 342A that the state governments shall have the power to identify and include the OBCs or socially and educationally backward classes in their respective lists The third clause will have to be inserted as Article 342A(3)
 - Accordingly, the third clause will state that the power to notify the OBCs on the state list would be with the state governments.
- The Lok Sabha passed the Factoring Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 2020, and the National Institute of Food Technology Entrepreneurship and Management Bill, 2021.
 - ✓ The Factoring Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 2020 was moved for consideration and passage by the finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman
 - ✓ The changes in the legislation are aimed at helping the MSME sector to overcome the problems of delayed payments
 - ✓ The amendments to the factoring law are based on the recommendations of the U K Sinha Committee.
- In a landmark decision, the Union government has announced a 27% reservation for OBC, and a 10% reservation for EWS candidates in the All India Quota for UG and PG medical/dental courses in state-run colleges from the current academic year 2021-22 onwards
 - ✓ The All India Quota (AIQ) Scheme was introduced in 1986 under the directions of the Supreme Court
 - ✓ It seeks to provide merit-based opportunities to students from any state aspiring to study in a good medical college in another state
- Union Minister of State for Earth Sciences, Jitendra Singh launched a new portal for 'Earth System Science Data' during the 15th foundation day event of the Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES) on June.
- > The Union railway ministry has sanctioned a 23km-long line to provide direct connectivity from Karaikal to Peralam
 - ✓ The new line will be laid as part of the Trichy-Thanjavur-Nagore-Karaikal gauge conversion project at a budget of Rs.177.69 crore

- ✓ This was announced by Union railways minister Ashwini Vaishnaw.
- ✓ Karaikal is located at 140 kms south of Puducherry, while Peralam is in Tiruvarur district, Tamil Nadu
- The government introduced a Bill in the Lok Sabha to replace the Ordinance on the constitution of the Commission for Air Quality Management in Delhi-NCR and adjoining areas
- The Geological Survey of India (GSI) has taken up seven lithium exploration projects in Arunachal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Jammu & Kashmir and Rajasthan
- India's first 'Grain ATM' opened in Gurugram
 - ✓ The country's first 'Grain ATM' has been set up as a pilot project in Gurugram, Haryana. It is an automatic machine, which works just like a bank ATM.
- Karnataka Chief Minister, BS Yediyurappa has unveiled the Karnataka Electric Bike Taxi scheme- 2021.

✓ KVIC (Khadi and Village Industries Commission) has launched Project BOLD (Bamboo Oasis on Lands in Draught), a first of- its-kind exercise, to create bamboo-based green patches in arid and semi-arid land zones.

Common eligibility test for Central govt jobs from 2022

✓ The first common eligibility test (CET) to recruit non-technical group B and C government staff has been delayed due to Covid-19 pandemic and is unlikely to be held by the end of this year, a senior Union minister.

Cabinet extends Agri Infra Fund loans to APMCs

- ✓ The Centre has decided to allow state run market yards to access financing facilities through its Agricultural Infrastructure Fund to calm the fears of protesting farmers that such market yards are being weakened.
- India's first driverless pod taxis will connect Jewar international airport with Greater Noida
 - ✓ The first-ever pod taxi service in India is soon to start running between the upcoming Noida International Greenfield Airport (or Jewar Airport) and Noida Film City in Greater Noida, having a distance of around 14 km.

FATF review of India's anti-money laundering postponed to 2022 due to Covid

✓ An evaluation by global organisation Financial Action Task Force (FATF) to analyse the effectiveness of India's anti-money laundering and countering terrorist financing regime has been postponed for the second time in view of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and is now slated to be initiated next year.

- State Bank of India (SBI) has selected "PaisaloDigital" as the National Corporate Business Correspondent of the Bank for financial inclusion by providing banking services through kiosks.
- The Reserve Bank of India has accorded its approval to the Government of the Union Territory (UT) of Ladakh to acquire 8.23 per cent of the paid-up equity capital of Jammu and Kashmir Bank Limited as on the date on enforcement of Jammu and Kashmir reorganization Act 2019.
- NTPC Ltd., India's largest power generator is set to construct the country's single-largest solar photovoltaic project at Rann of Kutch region in Khavada, Gujarat.
 - ✓ The solar power park will have a capacity of 4.75 Gigawatt (Gw)/4750 MW.
- The union government has created a Ministry of Cooperation to boost the Indian cooperative movement and give a fillip to the indigenous enterprises.
 - ✓ The new ministry of Cooperation will work to realise the vision of "Sahkar -se -Samriddhi" and will provide a separate administrative, legal and policy framework

IOC to set up first 'green hydrogen' plant at Mathura

✓ State-owned Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), India's largest oil firm, will build the first 'green hydrogen' plant of the country at its Mathura refinery, to meet the growing demand for both oil and cleaner forms of energy.

Government to set up Indian Heritage Institute in Noida

✓ The government has decided to set up the Indian Institute of Heritage at Noida, Uttar Pradesh.

> Digital Platform "Kisan Sarathi" launched to facilitate farmers

✓ In order to facilitate farmers to get 'right information at right time' in their desired language, a digital platform namely 'KisanSarathi' was launched jointly by Narendra Singh Tomar, Minister for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare.

- ✓ The Atmanirbhar Bharat Rojgar Yojana (ABRY) is an employment generation scheme that encourages the creation of normal jobs in the country.

Pension orders given under PRAYAS project

- ✓ The Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) in Tambaram distributed Pension Payment Orders (PPOs) to the retiring employees of two organisations through the PRAYAS project.
- ✓ PRAYAS is an initiative of the EPFO, whereby the PPOs are distributed to the employees on the day of superannuation itself.
- Cabinet approves continuation of centrally sponsored scheme National AYUSH Mission for 5 years from FY 2021-2026
 - ✓ The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has approved the continuation of Centrally Sponsored Scheme 'National AYUSH Mission (NAM)' for another five years.
 - ✓ Centre has allocated Rs. 4607.30 crore (Rs 3,000 crore as Central Share and Rs. 1607.30 crore as State Share) for the scheme to be invested over five years.
 - ✓ The NAM Mission was first launched on 15 September, 2014.
 - ✓ The objective of the mission is to provide cost effective AYUSH Services by focusing on core competency areas of AYUSH like Ayurveda, Sidhha, Sowa Rigpa, Unani and also Homeopathy (ASU&H) which are a treasure house of knowledge for preventive, promotive and curative healthcare.

Centre extends 'Stand Up India Scheme' up to 2025

✓ The Government of India has extended the duration of 'Stand Up India Scheme' up to the year 2025.

> One Bharat, Unnat Bharat, scheme: UGC Instruction for Educational Institutions

✓ The UGC has instructed to send a report on the programs conducted in the educational institutions under the 'One Bharat Unnata Bharat' scheme of the Central Government.

SMILE Scheme - Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment

✓ The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment has developed a scheme called "SMILE' Support for Marginalized Individuals for Livelihood and Enterprise," which includes a sub-scheme called "Central Sector Scheme for Comprehensive Rehabilitation of Persons Involved in Begging.

COURT VERDICT

- The Madras High Court has ruled that no public buildings can be constructed in the state without providing access and toilet facilities to differently abled people.
 - ✓ The verdict was pronounced by the first bench of Chief Justice Sanjib Banerjee and Justice Senthilkumar Ramamoorthy on July
 - ✓ The bench held that the official respondents, particularly the public works department and its officials, should be acquainted with the governing statute and the national building code.
 - ✓ This is to ensure that the mandatory instructions therein are adhered to without any exception, as per the Court.
- The Madras high court directed the state government to take immediate steps to issue a separate certificate to the families of all eligible Covid-19 victims mentioning the cause of death
 - ✓ The new certificate will help the families in getting claim relief, if any, provided by the government.
- The Supreme Court sets aside provisions of Tribunal Reforms Ordinance 2021 brought by the Centre with respect to the four-year tenure for members and chairpersons of tribunals
