


The Gympie-Gympie, scientifically known as Dendrocnide moroides, is notorious as the most toxic plant in the world, primarily found in rainforests of Australia, Indonesia, and the Moluccas.



- Despite its unassuming appearance with heart-shaped leaves, this stinging tree is covered with fine, hair-like trichomes loaded with powerful neurotoxins.
- Contact with the plant causes excruciating pain described as being "burnt with hot acid and electrocuted at the same time," with effects that can persist for weeks or even months.
