

> National Turmeric Board Launched to Elevate India's 'Golden Spice'



- On January 14, 2025, Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Shri Piyush Goyal, inaugurated the National Turmeric Board in New Delhi, appointing Shri Palle Ganga Reddy as its first Chairperson.
- The Board's headquarters is established in Nizamabad, Telangana, a prominent turmeric-producing region.

> PM Modi inaugurates Z-Morh tunnel in Kashmir

 Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the 6.5 km Z-Morh tunnel in Central Kashmir's Ganderbal district.



- ✓ The 6.5 km long two-lane tunnel connecting Gagangir and Sonamarg in Ganderbal district was constructed at an expenditure exceeding ₹2,700 crore.
- Located at an altitude of more than 8,650 feet above sea level, the Z-Morh tunnel will significantly improve year-round connectivity between Srinagar and Sonamarg, facilitating the route to Leh while bypassing the landslide-prone and avalanche-affected areas.

Kho Kho World Cup

The first edition of the Kho Kho World Cup was officially inaugurated at the Indira Gandhi Indoor Stadium, New Delhi. Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, Indian Olympic Association President P. T. Usha and Kho Kho Federation of India President Sudhanshu Mittal, lit the ceremonial torch of World Cup.



- ✓ Teams from 20 countries are participating in the Kho Kho World Cup 2025.
- ✓ Kho Kho World Cup 2025 features 20 men's and 19 women's teams.
- ✓ 15-member squads for both the men's and women's categories have been selected by the Kho-Kho Federation of India.
- ✓ Prateek Waikar is captain of the men's team.
- ✓ Priyanka Ingle will lead the women's team.
