ISRO Develops World's Largest Vertical Propellant Mixer

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has achieved a significant milestone by developing a 10-tonne vertical planetary mixer, the largest of its kind globally, for solid propellant production.



This indigenous mixer, created in collaboration with the Central Manufacturing Technology Institute (CMTI) in Bengaluru, is set to enhance the efficiency and safety of solid rocket motor manufacturing, marking a substantial advancement in India's space capabilities.

- New Bat Coronavirus HKU5-CoV-2 Discovered in China
- Chinese researchers have identified a new bat coronavirus, named HKU5-CoV-2, which has the ability to infect human cells.



- ✓ The virus uses the ACE2 receptor, the same pathway that SARS-CoV-2, the virus responsible for COVID-19, uses to enter human cells.
- The discovery has raised concerns about potential zoonotic transmission, emphasizing the need for continuous surveillance of bat-borne viruses.
